

Glossary

Coral (page 4, 5)

A colony of tiny little animals that live together in the sea.



Octopus (pages 5, 6, 7)

A sea animal with 8 arms, a soft body, and large eyes. It uses water jets to swim.



Eel (page 9)

A long fish that looks like a snake and has smooth, slimy skin.




Sea Turtle (page 8)

A turtle that lives in the sea and has paddle-shaped flippers for swimming.



Fish (page 10)

An animal that lives in water and has fins for swimming and gills for breathing.



Starfish (page 4)

Starfish are not really fish. They are star-shaped sea creatures with five arms and hundreds of tiny feet on their undersides.



Jellyfish (page 11)

Sea animals with soft, jelly like bodies and no bones. They have tentacles that they use to sting their prey.





Zebrafish (page 12)

Zebrafish are small, slender fish that have black (or blue) and yellow stripes.




The starfish sits on some coral.

She is in a rush.


A jellyfish bobs in the sea.






Datiz is a fan of fish fins.
