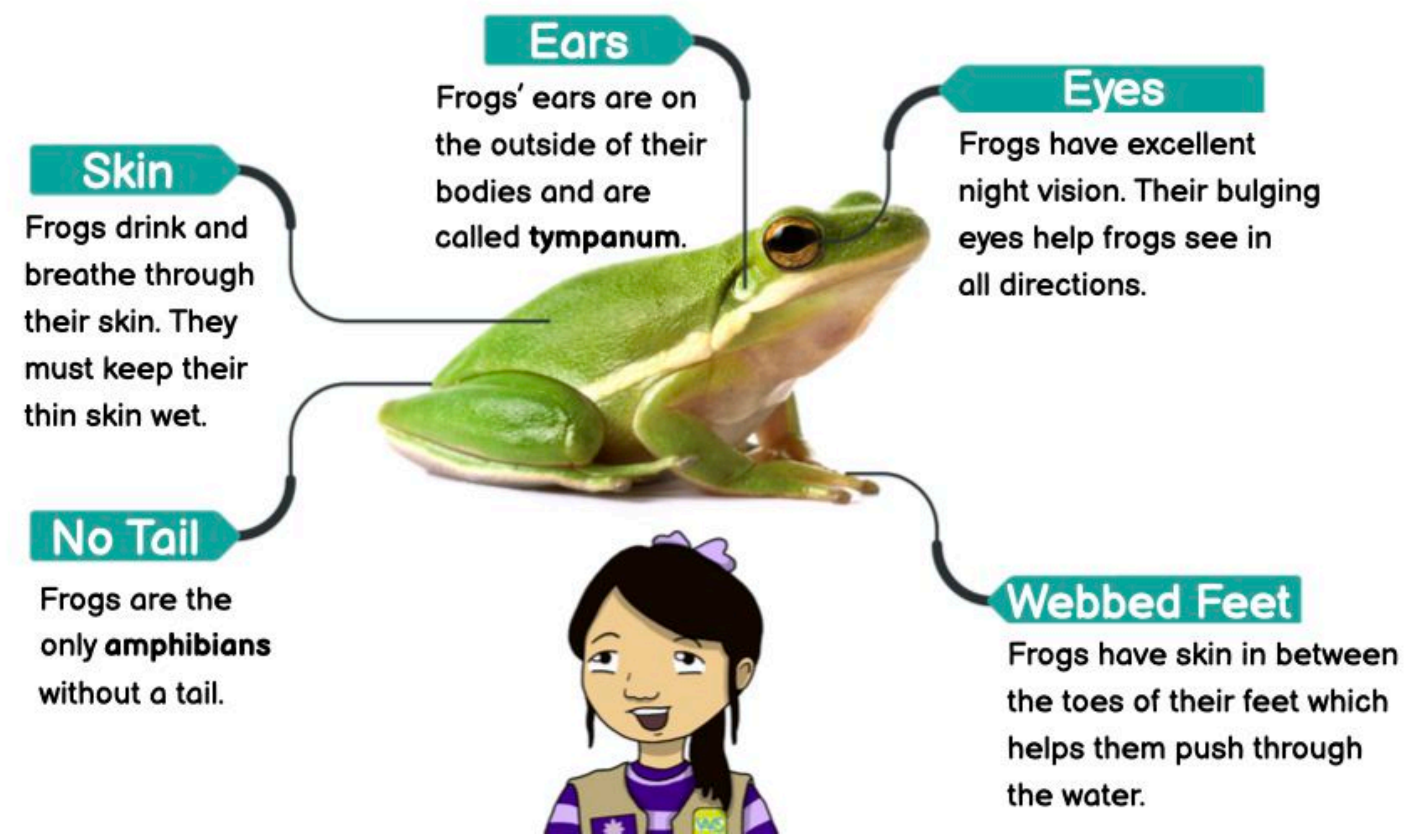


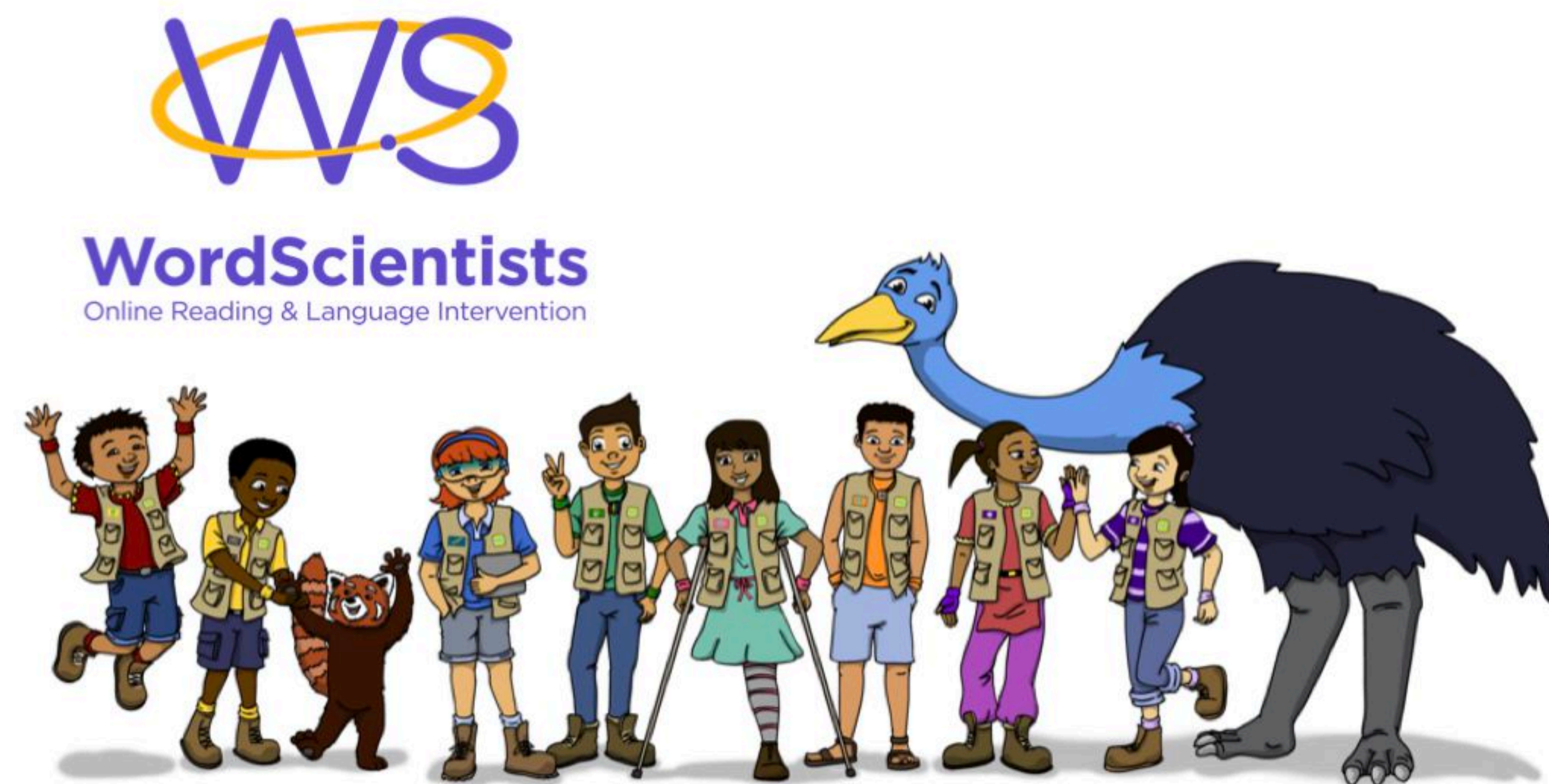



Frog Facts

- Frogs are carnivores; they eat insects and worms. Some large frogs eat small snakes, mice, baby turtles, and even other frogs.
- Frogs have sticky tongues that help them catch insects.
- Most frogs can change their colors to match their surroundings. This helps them hide from predators who would eat them.
- Poisonous frogs have bright colors that warn away predators.
- Frogs don't drink water. Instead they absorb it through their skin.
